This month we focus on our Secondary School Student Sponsorship Programme. This has had a real impact on the lives of many students since the programme began 20 years ago.

This month we would like to share the following stories with you.



Why are we doing this?

Primary School Education in Malawi - http://starfishmalawi.com/education-in-malawi is funded by the government.

However Secondary School education is fee-paying only.

So, for those families with barely enough money for food to survive, paying school fees is clearly out of the question.

In the academic year 2023-2024, we had 164 students in different secondary schools.

This year 26 sponsored students took their final exams and only one failed. Ten got scores high enough to apply for university and a further four, high enough for teacher training college.

It is encouraging that there has been a significant increase in the exam pass rates of our sponsored students.

31 of our former students are now currently at University, College or in Vocational Training.

All Students who have achieved a University placement must apply for a Government Grant for their fees. Starfish is unable to pay University fees. However, we do pay for transport and give pocket money for all students.

Frequently we are asked to pay accommodation and food costs for our university students who have obtained a Government Grant. Each request is carefully considered. Accommodation and food is expensive. We have known circumstances where all the parents are able to provide is a bag of maize and nothing more. The Team in Salima makes enquiries as to the validity of the claims made.

Each year we are pleased to see some of our students graduate from universities and colleges and go on to work in government departments, become teachers or join an NGO.

We can say a lot about the programme, but it is so much better to read actual testimonies from students, like the following ones,

Clement Mussa was selected to Chipoka secondary school.

However, he lives with his single mother who struggles to take care of her children. He saw his dreams getting shattered as his mother honestly told him that no matter how much she may try, she may not manage to raise the school fees and all other things he needed to be in school.

This is when Starfish intervened to save his future.

Starfish helped him with school fees and other related needs such as transport and pocket money, dictionaries, mosquito nets and many more, from form 1 to 4. After writing his final exams, he was selected to Malawi University of Science and Technology to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Immunology.


Said Clement.
